






Substantive concepts definitions



Substantive concept	Definition
 <p><i>Monarchy and Empire</i></p>	The activity of governing a country or controlling; the way in which a country is governed. Such as: monarchy, emperors, government, or dictators.
 <p><i>Community and culture</i></p>	The living expression of culture in everyday life—anyone's culture—learned and passed on informally from person to person.
 <p><i>Gender stereotypes</i></p>	The practice of describing individual woman or man specific attributes, characteristics, or roles by reason only of her or his membership in the social group of women or men.
 <p><i>Movement of people</i></p>	The movement of people from one place to another with intentions of settling, permanently or temporarily, at a new location. Can be an invasion.
 <p><i>Religion and Beliefs</i></p>	The belief in or acknowledgement of some superhuman power or powers (esp. a god or gods) which is typically manifested in obedience, reverence, and worship; such a belief as part of a system defining a code of living, esp. as a means of achieving spiritual or material improvement.

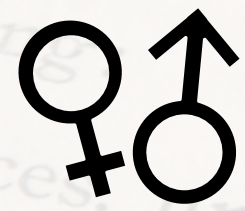
