### EVERY DAY COUNTS !!!

<b>96 %– 100% Very Good !</b>	You are giving your child the best chance to do well. Keep up the great work !!
<b>91% - 95% Worrying !</b>	Your child will find it much harder to progress, attendance will be monitored.
<b>85% - 90% Serious Concern !</b>	Your child will find it difficult to make good progress. Your child is now classed as persistent absent and meetings will be arranged with parents. This may result in a fine or legal intervention.

## Punctuality

Do you know that children who arrive a few minutes late start the day feeling more stressed and do not make a positive start to their learning? They often miss out on key messages and education. It disrupts the education of the rest of the class.

Being late to school has a significant impact on the amount of learning time lost over a school year.

The table gives you an indication of how much time is lost if regularly late.

Minutes late per day	Number of days missed over a year
5 Minutes	3 days
10 Minutes	6.5 days
15 Minutes	10 days
20 Minutes	13 days
30 Minutes	19 days

I will be contacting parents of children who have been persistently late over the Autumn term.

Meetings will be arranged with parents and any future lateness will be monitored closely.

Any children that arrive to school at 9:30am onwards will be given a U code on the register. If children receive 10 or more U codes parents can be fined £80:00 per parent per child.
