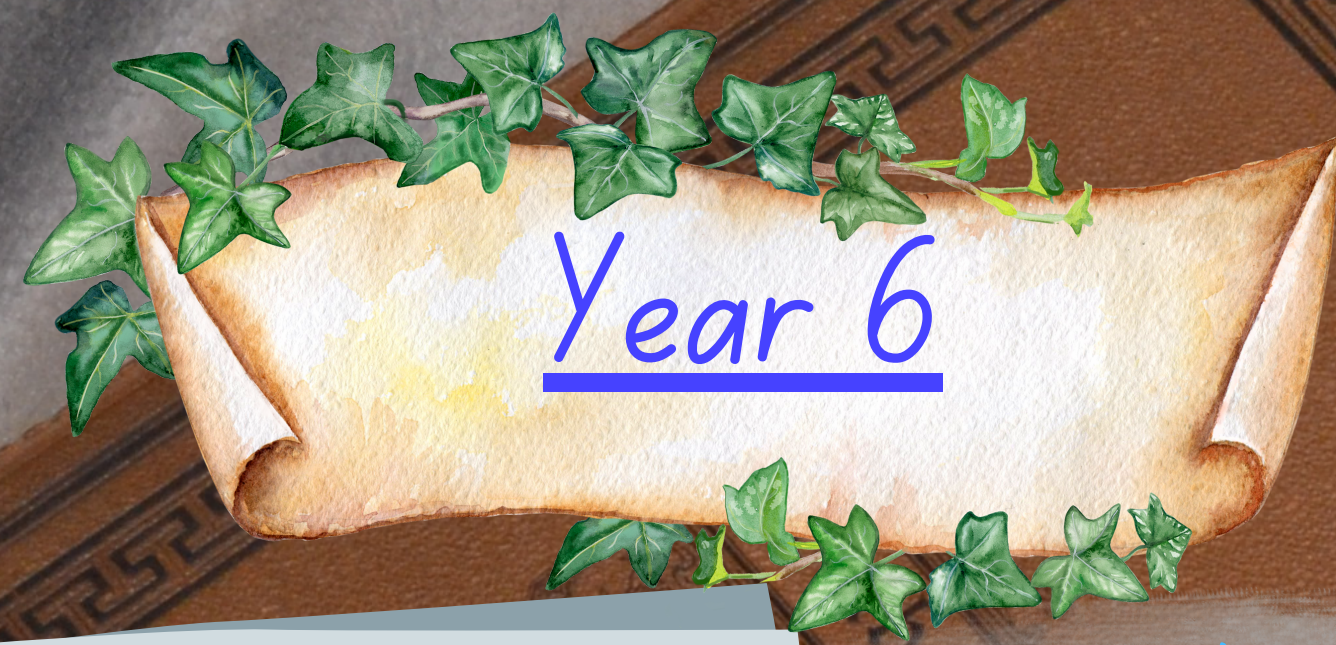

The Blitz was a German bombing campaign against the United Kingdom, in 1940 and 1941, during the Second World War.

To move people or to be moved from a dangerous place to somewhere safe

Kinder transport

The rescue of mainly Jewish children from Nazi German territory.

Nazi Germany

The German state between 1933 and 1945, when Adolf Hitler and the Nazi Party controlled the country,
